STAY ENGAGED DURING YOUR OFF SEASON

SCCA racers in West Michigan, like many other amateur and professional racers, can stay engaged and productive during the off-season to maintain and improve their racing skills, prepare their vehicles, and stay connected with the racing community. Here are some activities they can consider:

- 1. Vehicle Maintenance and Upgrades:
 - Use the off-season to perform necessary maintenance on their racing vehicles, including engine overhauls, suspension adjustments, and brake system maintenance.
 - Install any planned upgrades or modifications to improve the performance of their car.
- 2. Driver Training:
 - Participate in advanced driving and racing schools to further develop their skills.
 - Consider enrolling in defensive driving courses to enhance their overall driving abilities.
- 3. Fitness and Conditioning:
 - Maintain physical fitness through regular exercise and conditioning to stay in peak racing shape.
